

EUROPEAN DAY OF LANGUAGES 26 September





Eucharist takes place on the second Friday of each half term and is delivered by the St Dunstan's Church team in the school prayer room.


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


Year 8 have been looking at Warhol's food illustrations and creating their own in class and as homework.

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








A line is a dot that went for a walk
